The falls are called "maiden's tears' because the water falls down silently from cracks in the cliff approx. 100 m high, giving the impression of tears. In winter, one can approach the area with snow shoes (rental shoes are available).




Approx. 10min. by car from Utoro in Shari Town to Shiretoko National Park Nature Center (Approach on foot along walking track from the Center.)

7 Shiretoko Goko Lakes (Five Lakes)


Mysterious five lakes surrounded by primeval forests. The scenery from viewing platforms create a majestic panorama of nature.

Late Apr. - late Nov. (7:30 - 18:00)

Routine buses are operated 4 times a day from Utoro Onsen(Hot Springs) During the busy season, like the summer more shuttle bus services are offered

It is a flowing hot spring that wells up from the hillside of Mt. Io-zan, an active volcano, and runs directly into a river.

Accessible period: early June - late Oct. The road between the Shiretoko Goko Lakes (Five Lakes) and Kamuiwakka can be used.

*Please make sure of the details ahead of time, because passage of ordinary vehicles may sometimes not be allowed.




Oshinkoshin Falls

Cool, refreshing falls falling from the top of a cliff. They are called "beautiful twin falls" since one stream is divided in two falls, and this scene has been selected as one of the 100 Best Falls in Japan. One can get close enough to the falls to almost get wet while climbing the steps that lead up to the height of the middle area of the falls. It is a splendid experience. In winter, the view of white sea covered with drift ice as far as the eye can see is also really impressive.

Oronkoiwa Rock

It is a huge massive rock that is over 60 m high. and is located near the Utoro Port. It is said to be named after the Orok (Uilta) tribe, one of the indigenous peoples who used to live here. After climbing to the top of the rock along 170 stone steps, one has a panoramic view of the blue, transparent sea of Okhotsk through which one can see the reefs under the sea, all the way to Utoro town and the Shiretoko Mountain Range.
